From the Pastor's Study....

Sitting on the porch of the parsonage this morning wrapped in a colorful hand-crocheted blanket and the slight chill of the August air I felt a familiar sadness as the summer ends and the seasons turn. I love the Fall. In many ways it is my favorite season of the year. What I don't love is to feel the steady, speedy march of time. Yesterday someone said to me, "Only sixteen weeks 'til Christmas," and my stomach clenched. Someone else said (and I paraphrase), "I am always focused on the what is coming next, what I have to do in the future. I need to get better at being present in the "now," this day, this moment, this engagement with the person who is with me."

The writer of Ecclesiastes says: "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." In this same reflection on time, s/he writes that God puts a "sense of past and future in our minds" Our present time is sandwiched between what has been and what will be. We can become too focused on what is behind us that we can't let go of, or what is before us that makes us feel anxious, that we are barely able to be present to the present. And I suppose our greatest, underlying anxiety about the future and the rapid passage of time is that our days are numbered, our time on earth will run out, we will die.

This is no small anxiety. It is real and persistent even when we are not explicitly conscious of it. This anxiety often drives us to make the most of the time that we have. I am obsessed about not wasting time and about getting things done. But this morning, praying and sitting on the porch with the sun rising before my eyes, I realize that this fleeting moment is where time touches eternity. And that God is present in every second of every day. And that all of our days, all of our lives are wrapped secure within the life of God which never ends.

So I begin today, resting in this knowledge, this mystery, this gift of divine love. I begin today feeling a little less anxious about the hurried passage of time, determined to be more fully present to the gift of this day, and of all that happens within it, even while I think about and plan for the future. God is the eternity of life and love that embraces all time and all being without end. Nothing is lost. Together we can breathe deeply and embrace the gift of today as we anticipate and prepare for what is yet to come. Flip this page over to see what lies ahead....
